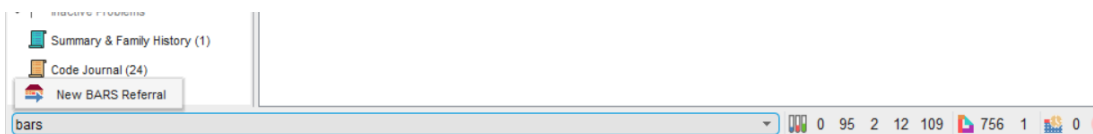
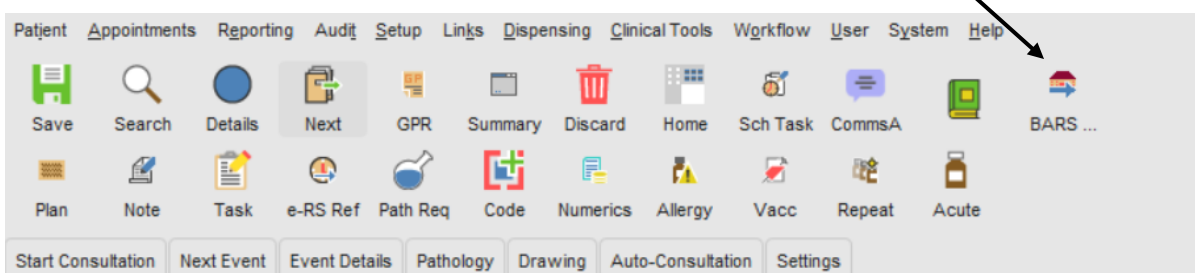


BARS Referrals to the Pharmacy First Scheme in SystmOne

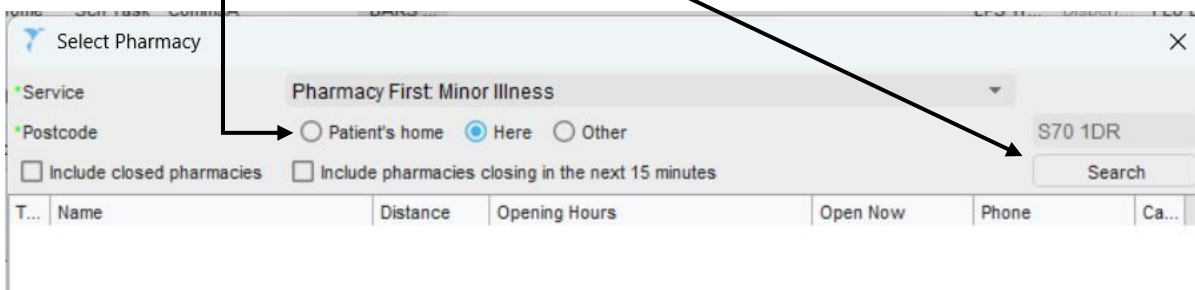


Open a new BARS referral. These can be accessed using the SystmOne search bar in the bottom of the screen (see above).

Alternatively, the button can be added to the toolbar at the top of the screen.



Find the pharmacy the patient wishes to be referred to. Pharmacies can be identified by proximity to the patient's address or the surgery. Click search.



Select the pharmacy, and click ok at the bottom of the screen.

Click on the Known Telecoms button. This will allow you to populate the patient's contact details from their record.

(Practice Appt - pregnant, breastfeeding, unwell with fever)
- 3 INFECTED INSECT BITE
(Pharmacy 1st - aged over 1 year, ongoing 48 hours after bite / sting)
(Practice Appt - animal and human bites, occurred outside the UK, unwell with fever, pregnant)
- 4 SHINGLES
(Pharmacy 1st - Aged Over 18, and rash appeared in the last 3 to 7 days)
(Practice Appt - pregnant, breastfeeding, rash for more than 7 days)
- 5 SINUSITIS
(Pharmacy 1st - aged 12 years or over, symptoms for over 10 days)
(Practice Appt - recurrent infection, pregnant, symptoms for fewer than 10 days)
- 6 SORE THROAT
(Pharmacy 1st - aged over 5 years)
(Practice Appt - recurrent infection, had tonsils removed, pregnant)

The buttons on the right of the following screen allow you to (respectively):

Change the order of your presets,

Add a new preset,

Edit an existing preset,

Delete an existing preset.

The presets for the seven clinical pathways conditions are available at the end of this guide.

To copy presets from another user, click the option at the bottom of the screen.

On the next screen, select who you would like to copy them from, and click ok.

To add one of your presets into your referral, double-click on it in your list, or press the number next to it on your keyboard .

When all the mandatory fields of your referral are complete, click ok to send it to the pharmacy.

Seven Clinical Pathways Conditions:

EAR INFECTION

(Pharmacy 1st - aged between 1 and 17 years)

(Practice Appt - recurrent infection, pregnant)

IMPETIGO

(Pharmacy 1st - aged over 1 year, fewer than 4 spots)

(Practice Appt - pregnant, breastfeeding, unwell with fever)

INFECTED INSECT BITE

(Pharmacy 1st - aged over 1 year, ongoing 48 hours after bite / sting)

(Practice Appt - animal and human bites, occurred outside the UK, unwell with fever, pregnant)

SHINGLES

(Pharmacy 1st - Aged Over 18, and rash appeared in the last 3 to 7 days)

(Practice Appt - pregnant, breastfeeding, rash for more than 7 days)

SINUSITIS

(Pharmacy 1st - aged 12 years or over, symptoms for over 10 days)

(Practice Appt - recurrent infection, pregnant, symptoms for fewer than 10 days)

SORE THROAT

(Pharmacy 1st - aged over 5 years)

(Practice Appt - recurrent infection, had tonsils removed, pregnant)

URINARY TRACT INFECTION

(Pharmacy 1st - Women aged 16 to 64)

(Practice Appt - male, pregnant, breastfeeding, recurrent UTI, catheter, back pain)
