

South Yorkshire ICB Medicines Optimisation Quality Improvement/Incentive Scheme 2026/29

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Scheme Background

For 2026/27, the historic place approaches have been **reviewed, aligned, and harmonised** to create this **single South Yorkshire ICB Medicines Optimisation Quality Improvement/Incentive Scheme**. This approach supports:

- Reduction in unwarranted variation across South Yorkshire
- Improved equity of access and quality outcomes for patients by recognising that medicines are an investment
- Maximising system-wide financial efficiency
- Streamlining engagement with practices

The scheme places emphasis on efficiency savings alongside an ongoing focus on quality improvement, patient safety, and cost-effective prescribing. This reflects the significant financial challenges across the NHS and need to make best use of our

resources. It also allows the system to invest in new medicines and treat more patients in turn helping to improve patient care and outcomes

Aims of the Scheme

The scheme aims to:

- Improve patient care and outcomes through safe, cost effective and clinically effective prescribing
- Reduce variation across South Yorkshire
- Support high-quality, evidence-based prescribing
- Strengthen clinical leadership within general practice and practice engagement with the ICB
- Secure longer term predictable investment into GP practices

Scheme Design Principles

The scheme has been developed collaboratively by the South Yorkshire Medicines Optimisation (SY MO) team based on the following principles:

- **Harmonisation** – one consistent scheme across South Yorkshire
- **Clinical focus** – delivering improved patient outcomes in line with SYICB strategy & national policy
- **Financial sustainability** – prioritising areas with highest measurable efficiencies
- **Deliverability** – aligned to existing workflows and the new model of MO strategic operation from 2026
- **Move away from annual cycles of investment**

The scheme **complements local and/or national contractual** requirements (e.g. place quality incentive schemes, QOF, PCN DES, IIF), and if overlap exists, additional requirements have been included to maximise impact.

Financial

The 3-year scheme is designed to support delivery whilst ensuring value for money supporting reinvestment in the treatment of new medicines

- Total payments are capped at **£1.57** per registered patient based on February 2026 list size, with an inflation linked uplift based on September figures each year
- The total initial investment will be £2,403,540
- Payments will be proportional to work completed against agreed targets for included metrics
- It is proposed that this will be a recurrent investment of the next 3 years, with the metrics/priorities amending each year. Over the schemes lifetime this

represents approximately £7.43m of secured investment into GP practices. For an example 10,000 patient practice this equates to around £48,500 of investment or around £100k for the largest practices in SY. At least 32% (£15.5k - £31k) will be paid to practices for signing up to the scheme and committing to engaging with the aims within the scheme. [Appendix B](#) summarises minimum and max payments per practice.

Timeline

The scheme will be operational from the **14th of July 2026** to the **31st of March 2029** with an annual review of the priorities and programmes of work to be included.

Scheme Structure

The 2026/29 scheme consists of three components worth a % of the total scheme pot. The work within each component and its measures will be reviewed and updated for each year of the scheme operation, with partner engagement and negotiation

For the first year the 3 components are as follows:

A. Financial Performance (10% = £240,354 = £0.157 per patient)

The aim is to maintain and increase awareness of the relationship between practice prescribing spend and performance against the target budget

- Where practices are within their indicative practice budget, they will be eligible to an annual payment of **£0.157** per patient

Or

- Where practices are less than or equal to 1% above their indicative practice budget, **OR** a **3%** reduction in your 25/26 overspend (25/26 expenditure compared to 26/27 expenditure) they will be eligible to an annual payment of **£0.079 (5%)** per patient

B. Core (Gateway) Work (32% = £769,132 = £0.502 per patient)

The 32% assigned to this section is an **upfront payment each year and** will be made on sign-up to enable practices to obtain additional staffing capacity to plan and undertake work, these payments are inclusive and NOT additional to the total practice reward against the scheme, although this metric has **no specific measures (excluding Point of Prescribing system)** practices' engagement and evidence of activities undertaken in line with the below will be considered by the ICB. Practices are expected to deliver work across all core workstreams unless otherwise agreed.

Participating practices will:

- Sign up to the three-year scheme by the 27th of July 2026 see [link](#)
- Nominate a *Medicines Optimisation (MO) Clinical Champion* (e.g PCN Pharmacist/Lead Pharmacist/GP) who will:
 - Lead delivery of prescribing improvement activity within the practice
 - Act as the main point of contact with the MO team
 - Attend two meetings for one hour on Microsoft teams with the MO team
 - Cascade prescribing guidance and learning within the practice, this could be part of the regular practice meeting
 - Support implementation of system priorities e.g. consider hosting Foundation Trainee Pharmacists within general practice if deemed appropriate, please note this is not mandatory please complete [Appendix C](#)
 - Demonstrate implementation and use of a local communication arrangement with local pharmacies to efficiently manage alternative prescription requests due to medicines supply issues
 - Promote use of point of prescribing (POP) software within the practice
 - Support antimicrobial stewardship and waste reduction initiatives

This role is a key enabler of scheme delivery and clinical engagement.

c. Quality and Efficiency Core Areas (58% = £1,394,053 = £0.911 per patient)

This involves the delivery of several priority medicines optimisation workstreams across all SY practices against set targets. The programme is designed to deliver measurable clinical benefit and recurrent financial efficiencies

Areas include:

- Respiratory optimisation: beclometasone/formoterol pMDI inhaler review and SABA reduction
- QIPP Reviews
- Cardiometabolic optimisation: Review of SGLT2 Inhibitor Prescribing
- Diabetes optimisation: Review of DPP-4 Inhibitor Prescribing

- Opioid reduction in chronic pain
- Antimicrobial stewardship
- National Community Pharmacy Contraception Service

These areas have been selected due to their:

- Significant quality and financial opportunity across all SY practices
- High clinical impact improving patient care and outcomes, whilst reducing health inequalities across SY
- Alignment with national, regional, and local priorities

The metrics detailed in [Appendix A](#) support national, regional and local priorities, practices will have undertaken work in some of these areas previously but continued focus and optimisation is needed to improve patient care, safety and outcomes and optimise the use of the primary care workforce.

Termination and Review

Either Party may terminate this scheme by giving not less than three (3) months' written notice to the other Party.

The Parties acknowledge that this scheme may require amendment or cessation in response to changes in national policy, commissioning intentions, funding arrangements, or local service requirements. Where practicable, the Parties will discuss and seek to agree any necessary amendments before exercising this termination provision.

Termination will not affect any commitments or obligations that have accrued prior to the date of termination.

Payments to Practices

Payments will be approved centrally by the ICB governance process, and will be made following validation of achievement by the Medicines Optimisation Team and the Finance Team

EQIA (Quality Impact Assessment)

An EQIA has been completed prior to implementation

The scheme supports:

- Reduction in medicines-related inequalities
- Improved access to safe, cost effective and clinically effective treatment for patient across SY

Monitoring and Reporting

- Practices will have access to a performance dashboard hosted on the [InSYghts Primary Care InSYghts Portal](#)
- Data will be sourced from EPACT, PrescQIPP, point of prescribing systems and Open Prescribing
- The frequency of reporting will occur monthly
